## **City-Wide Code Enforcement**

Dear Citizen,

In order to maintain a clean and healthy environment, The City of Madison is conducting a city-wide code enforcement. This is a courtesy letter to give you time to correct any violations you may have. At the beginning of April, all violation letters will be sent via certified mail or through the Greenwood County Sheriff's Office. Failure to abate the conditions that are in violation within the time allowed, from the date you are served a notice, will result in prosecution in Municipal Court. For your convenience and to better serve you, we have included examples of possible violations from the City code. Violations may include, but are not limited to:

- **Junk in the yards**
- **50% peeling paint**
- **Trash**
- **Weeds**
- **Inoperable vehicles (vehicles without current tags are considered inoperable)**
- **Indoor furniture outdoors**
- **Roofs with holes**
- **Broken or boarded windows**

The City of Madison will be bringing in roll-off carts early this year to encourage citizens to clean up any junk. Carts will be available around the second week in March, and will be located in front of the basketball court at the City Park.

**Rules that apply to the trash carts are:**

- 1) No tires or paint**
- 2) No opening the backs of the trash cans.**
- 3) No taking trash out of the carts.**
- 4) These are for residential use only.**

**Fines will be charged to anyone caught violating these regulations.**

The City of Madison is enforcing these ordinances to ensure the well-being and cleanliness of our town and its citizens. Thank you for helping us to make this possible.
